Those who know Robert, know him as a friendly man who is very artistic. If you have seen any of his art-work you will know what we mean by <u>artistic</u>.

Robert says he has always liked drawing and painting. After graduation from Alamogordo High School, he went to college to take art classes. Now he continues his art education through self-teaching step-by-step books on special art techniques.

Robert was born in Alamogordo, New Mexico and has fond memories of of growing up there. Of course, being so close to White Sands National

House Managers are on-call so they can be reached at any time. Of course, they do have time off on Wednesday and the weekends when they

Robert has 3 brothers and 3 sisters and he is the second to the oldest. As an 11-year old boy, Robert was badly burned when he and his brother started a fire while playing. Robert went into shock and received 3rd degree burns.

Robert has traveled all around the world when he was in the Navy as a boiler technician and a fireman. His ship was the USS Canada. In his almost 4 years in the Navy he traveled to Australia, New Zealand, Hawaii, Europe, Africa, the South Pacific and Hawaii. He has fond memories of his travels and time stationed in Washington State.

Robert's grandfather, Oscar HIll, started the Spanish Baptist church great-grandfather, James Hill, was also a Baptist Preacher. Robert enjoys going to church and reading his Bible and finds solace in reading it when he is scared or upset.

Another good option is to contact the House Manager via e-mail. They do check their e-mail regularly and can be of service to communicate with you via the Internet.


Each house has a unique phone number and your House Manager has a cell phone number. You can call the office if you need this information, or contact the House Manager.
